### **A 'New' Lund-Hoel To Visit**

Recent major exterior maintenance and repair dates back to 2004. The back porch roof was stripped, sheathing and fascia trim were repaired and new cedar shingles put on.

In the fall of 2004 bids were let to have the entire roof of the Lund-Hoel House and the carriage shed re-shingled. The contracted project started early spring of 2005 by removing several layers of old shingles (asphalt and cedar) and repair of sheathing and trim where necessary. Also in the fall of 2005 all of the second story outside balcony rails were taken down and rebuilt. The tin on two decks was repaired prior to re-installing the rails. The
